This is a major study of near-death experiences with the newly born, babies, toddlers, and children up to age five. NDE expert P. M. H. Atwater reveals how those who experience a near-death state or other worlds at a very young age are profoundly affected for the rest of their lives, including developing psychic and intuitive abilities, higher intelligence, and “wisdom beyond their years,” plus a pervasive feeling of being “homesick for heaven.” Drawing on interviews with nearly 400 childhood experiencers, both full matured and young, she explores their accounts of what it is like to be alive on the other side of death as well as what makes them different from others. Where it takes the average adult experiencer 7 to 10 years to integrate their experience, it takes the average child experiencer 20 to 40 years. In contrast to older child/teen/adult experiencers, little ones cannot compare before with after - as they do not have a before. Their knowledge of the afterlife affects their family life, school, dating, health, education, employment, and sense of the spiritual, along with a potential for thoughts of suicide, out-of-body experiences, and PTSD symptoms.

Dr. PMH Atwater, L.H.D. had three near-death experiences in three months in 1977. The following year, because of what she was told to do during her third experience, she turned to research. Her research base today numbers nearly 5,000 adult and child experiencers, and resulted in 18 books, along with 6 more for children (Animal Lights Series). Some of her findings have been verified in clinical settings, among them the prospective study done in Holland and published in *Lancet Medical Journal* (12-15-01). Her ***The Big Book of Near-Death Experiences*** brought the entire field up-to-date, and was featured in an online version of *Newsweek Magazine*. Seldom mentioned is the decade she spent in Idaho long before her NDEs, experimenting with and researching altered states of consciousness and the transformational process with over 3,000 people. A recipient of numerous awards, her latest work, ***The Forever Angels: Near-Death Experiences in Childhood and Their Lifelong Impact***, challenges the entire field of near-death studies and changes the conversation about life and death, reincarnation, and the Life Continuum.

Title: “44 Years and Counting.” For the first time, Dr. Atwater will talk about what it was like after her three NDEs, leaving Idaho, and beginning her research of near-death states. In looking back, she invites everyone to do the same. What is it like for you now? How have you changed? Was there pain and sacrifice with the LOVE you received? Dark and Light? Admission \$15.
